Over the past few weeks, our Year 9 and 10 Food Technology students have participated in an exciting Master Chef-style competition. Working in groups, students were challenged to create and cook a main meal within 60 minutes, followed by a dessert challenge (on a separate week), which was also completed within 60 minutes.

Prior to each cook, teams were given time to carefully plan their own unique recipes using a selection of ingredients and quantities. To add an extra level of creativity, each group could choose one 'challenge ingredient' from a set list and select their own 'secret ingredient' to incorporate into their dish. The pressure of working against the clock, plating up professionally, and presenting to a panel of three judges made for an exciting experience.

A huge thank you to our guest judges who joined me throughout the competition; Renee, Shane, Theresa, Mr Waldie, Mrs Stuart, Letty, and Ruth. The students embraced the challenge with enthusiasm and teamwork. I was extremely impressed by the outstanding quality, creativity, and presentation of the dishes produced.

Heads Up For Kids

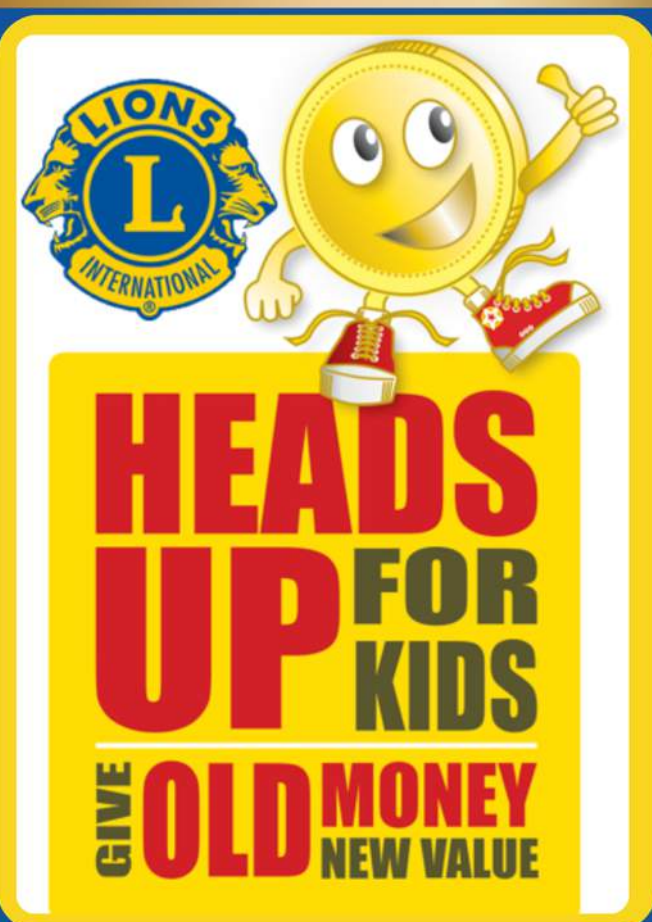

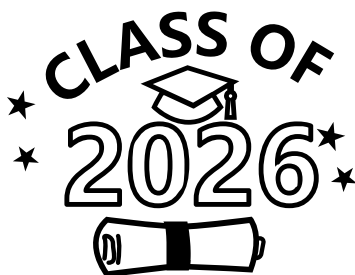

- Recovering after hard moments
- Asking for help
- Taking space when needed
- Reconnecting after conflict
- Learning with support
- Advocating for themselves and others

Tamariki learn regulation through relationships

When tamariki feel understood and supported during big emotions, they gradually build the skills to regulate them.

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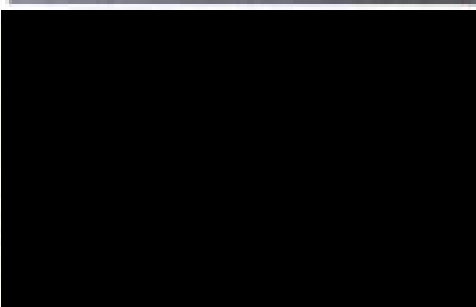
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
