Secondary News

Week 3 and we are well and truly getting into the swing of things. The school is a veritable hive of activity, with our younger students buzzing around school, keeping themselves busy (and hopefully warm and dry).

There are a number of fantastic Education Outside The Classroom opportunities coming up over the next few weeks, including our cross country/colour run, South Island Netball (from what I have heard, we are also doing well in the weekend netball league), and some of our younger students being off at a rugby tournament. We are also constantly keeping our ear to the ground for any additional opportunities that may be on the horizon. It is great to see the students getting out and amongst it.

Term 3 for the Secondary Syndicate becomes our critical time of focus, and as such, it is in our Senior school where the majority of my focus has been so far this term.

The students have been briefed, prompted, cajoled, persuaded, convinced, and instructed that Term 3 is the most crucial time of the year—a time where students in Years 11–13 suddenly become sentient around questions like "How many credits have I got?", "Is this worth credits... how many?", and "If I complete this, will I have enough to...?".

For many of our students, we are approaching their self-imposed "finishing line." They are finalising the last few of their internal assessments and casting a weary and/or wary eye at the looming "externals." For some, these externals become important because they are going for endorsements (where they can gain an NCEA certificate at Merit and/or Excellence level); for others, it is with thoughts towards future pathways (in school, tertiary, or the workplace).

With this in mind, you should expect any student in Years 11–13 to be much more focused on getting work done, potentially revising at home, and starting to become more inquisitive in terms of what the future may hold. What they will know is that the final 3 weeks of the term are when Derived Grade Exams are being held. These exams are crucial in many ways, and any absences during this time have the genuine potential to have a serious knock-on effect in terms of externals. More information regarding what these exams are and their significance will appear in the next newsletter, but for now, being aware of them looming on the horizon is key.

It is important, therefore, for us to remind you (and them) of the importance of maximising attendance. A day missed is 5 hours of learning. One day a week over a term equates to 50 hours of missed schooling (which is 2 full weeks in school)... when we look at this over a year, it becomes increasingly concerning. We appreciate that absences are often beyond control, and in these instances, we appreciate your efforts to let the office (and, where required, individual teachers) know.

We have also had a push this term around uniform.

If your child has a genuine reason for their uniform being unavailable (not just because they left it outside in the rain, or it got covered in mud so they hid it in the washing basket and forgot to tell you), please let the form teacher know. We will give them a uniform pass and, if required, help them find some "back-up" uniform. If a uniform item is unavailable, please ensure that the temporary item does not have any obvious non-school logos or text. As the classrooms are nice and warm, hoodies and non-regulation sweaters or jackets can be safely removed when in class.

I have been told to try to end on a positive note, so what I can say is that our push to see an increase in the wearing of uniform is coming to fruition, and I truly appreciate the support you have shown around this. As always—stay safe (and warm).

FREE dental care is available for teens until their 18th birthday.

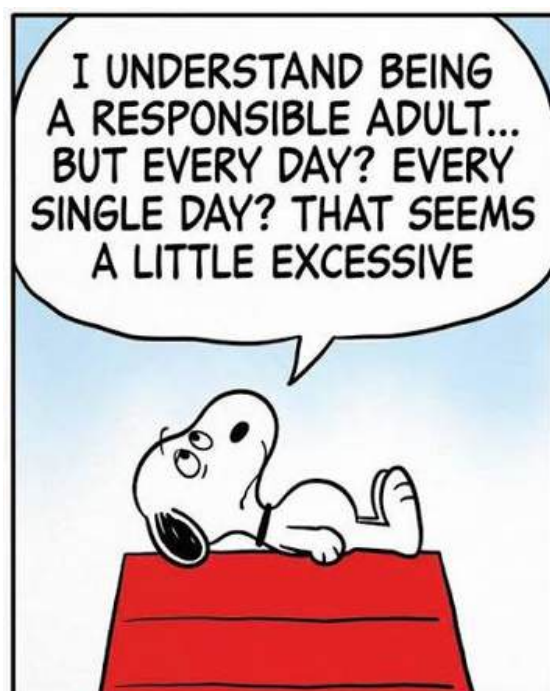
If your child is a Year 7 or 8 student, and they have not had their dental check-up this year, please contact the Community Oral Health Service before the end of the school year to book in!

Heads Up For Kids

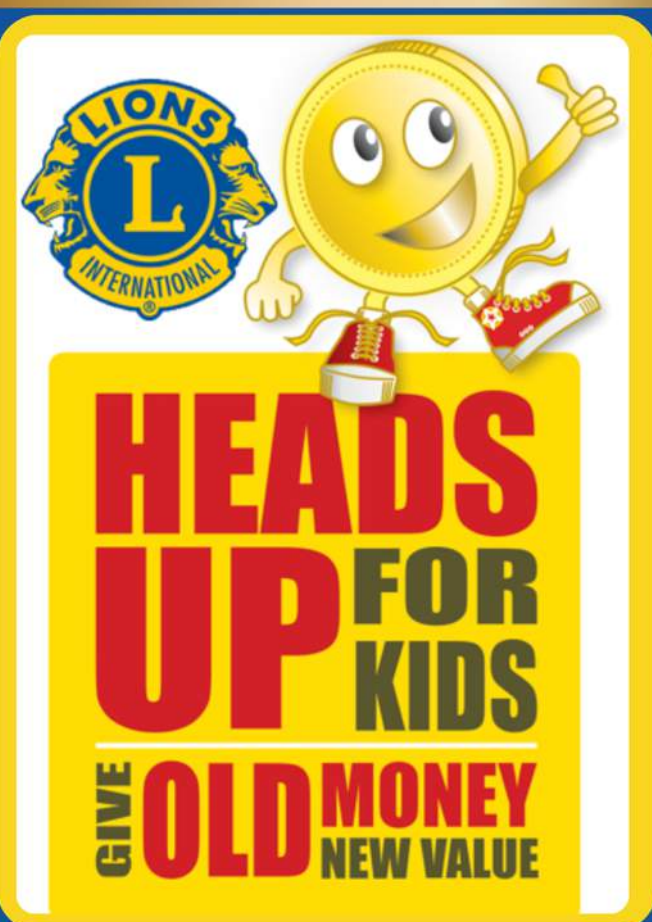

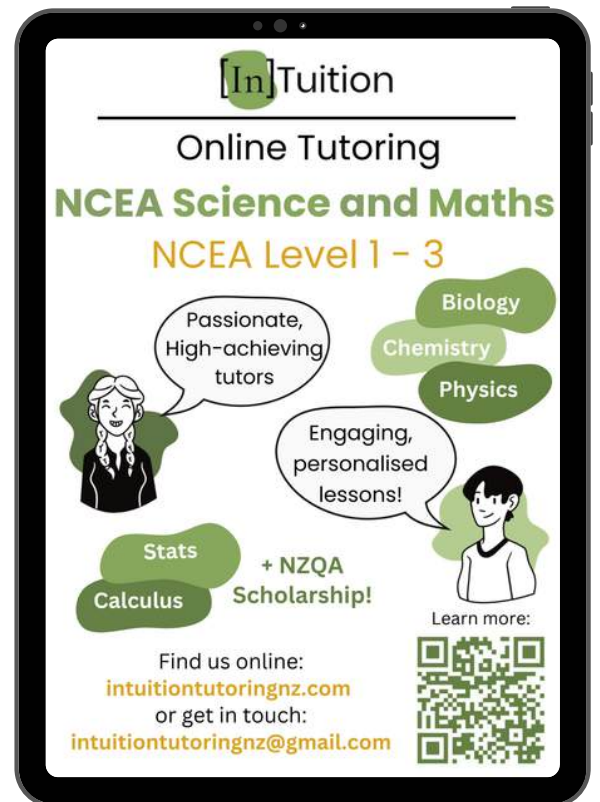

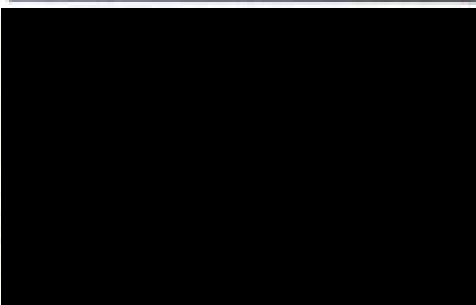
