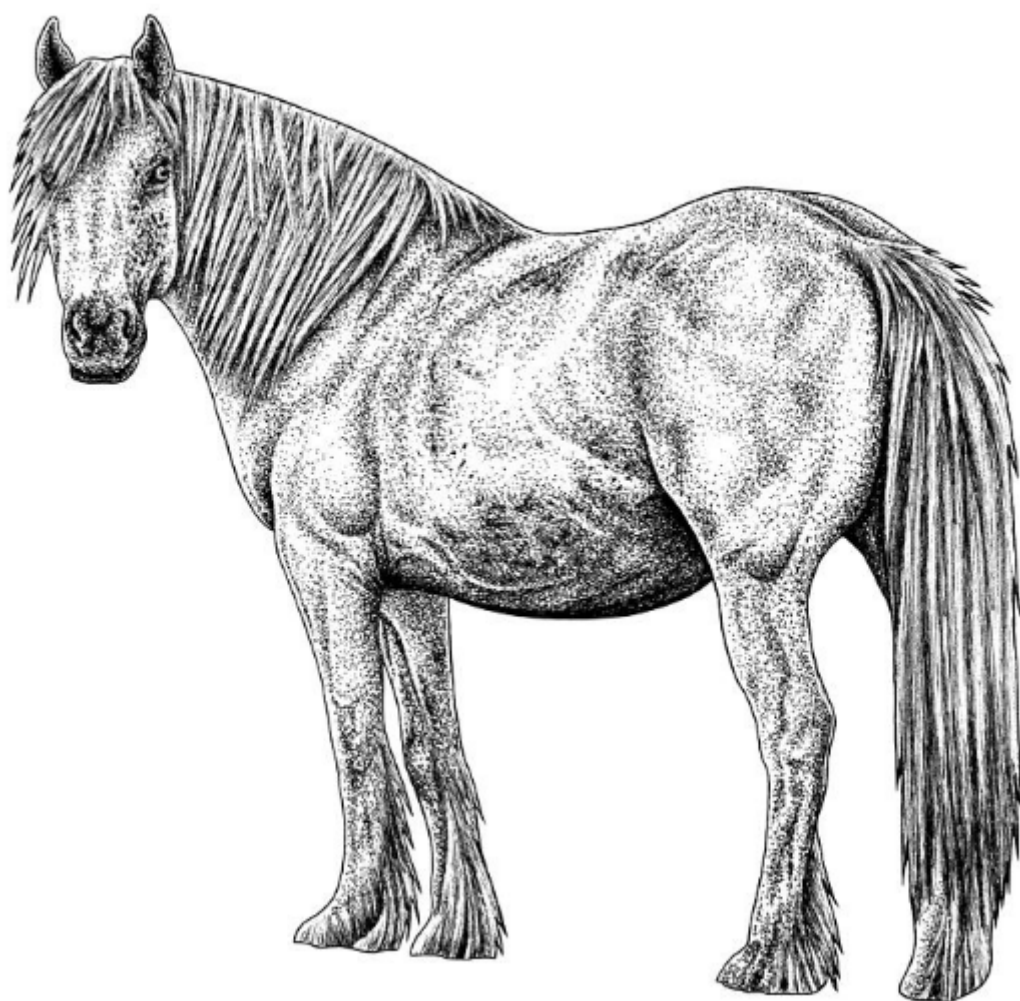

TRAINING TIPS

You will need to train your horse to walk forward beside you, to turn, and to stop to get ready for pet day.

Coming to your Call

When teaching your horse to come to you, teach it with treats, each time you call it to come, either give it a treat and give it lots of pats.

Leading

Put a halter on your horse. When you want your horse to move forwards with you, start walking and pull softly on the lead, when your horse takes a step forward give it a treat. Repeat doing this until your horse understands what you are trying to do.

Stopping

When you want to stop your horse gently pull on the lead rope and remember to practice standing still as well. Make sure you don't yank on the halter too hard as this will scare your horse and will hurt its neck.

Tying Up

You can also teach your horse how to tie up. Just tie the halter around a post, when your horse stands there quietly, reward it with a treat or take it away for a walk or back to its pen.

Keep it Fun

Remember to keep training fun, praise and pat your horse lots and give it treats when it does things right, keep training short so you both don't get tired and bored.
