As I begin the final newsletter for the year I am able to reflect on how fortunate I am to be your principal and how amazing the students in this school are. I have felt very supported by the staff, parents and the Board of Trustees. I have loved my first 2 terms and as I am looking out my window watching the Tui feeding on the flax bushes. I wonder how many others are this fortunate.

It was really pleasing to see so many of you at prizegiving. This is an opportunity to acknowledge our students efforts and celebrate excellence. Congratulations to all our prize winners.

This year we have made an award of Dux for our top academic school leaver. As a small school this may not be awarded every year. However, it is important that our top Year 13 student is acknowledged when their academic achievements are comparable with other top students in Marlborough. The moderation process for NCEA is robust and grades given to our students are equivalent to grades awarded in other schools in New Zealand.

My warmest congratulations to Martinet Gouws who is Dux of Rai Valley area School for 2018 and I wish her every success as she begins her studies in Veterinary Science.

Next year we are very excited to be joining Net NZ to provide a wider range of curriculum subjects for our year 11 to 13 students. This will mean that students who enrol in a course will be in class of 20 or less and have weekly face to face contact with their teacher through a video link. Our students will be able to access a wide range of subjects for example Electronics, Drama, Music, Accounting and a range of languages. These courses are delivered by teachers in schools throughout New Zealand and will offer a full range of NCEA levels including scholarship.



In recent weeks a number of classes have had the opportunity to enjoy a range of experiences out of school. There has been some amazing feedback from the organisations they have visited on their manners and behaviour. This reflects well on the school and the values of Respect, Achieve and Inspire, but is also a real credit to our parents.

This week a group of parents and I met with Robin Dunn from Marlborough District Council to begin an investigation to how we can upgrade our school playground to better serve the needs of all our students. A subcommittee of parents has been formed and they will feed back to the school during Term One with their findings and some possible plans. We look forward to being able to progress this next year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our amazing staff for all their outstanding work. In a time when a number of schools around the country are unable to get staff and classes are combined we are very fortunate. Our teachers and support staff all do a fantastic job.



Y12 Enviro 2018 By Alec Johnson Y12




Science
