This week a group of senior students was fortunate to spend a day out in the Marlborough Sounds on an aquaculture trip organised by Marlborough Chamber of Commerce Careers Adviser, Chris Shaw. It is really great that our students have the opportunity to see what future employment opportunities are available for them in our region.

I would like to thank Jamie Knight, who on behalf of the fire service did some training with a group of staff and students using fire extinguishers. It was a good opportunity for us to practice in case there is a fire within the school.

Last week I attended a Ministry of Education day to discuss the upcoming NCEA and in particular the new literacy and numeracy standards. These standards will be implemented next year and are likely to be assessed in most schools during Year 10. **There will be four Teacher-Only Days** this year, spread across Terms 2, 3, and 4 for teachers to develop new courses and assessments.

Children have been asked to walk or carry their scooters when they are moving around the primary classroom area and the outdoor deck as it is very dangerous to have the speed of a child on a scooter while 50 or more children and adults are moving about at bell times. In the mean time we are asking that they park their scooters along the chain-link fence line at the edge of the court. Helmets can come into cloak-bay spaces or lockers for safe keeping and to keep them dry.

## Sexwise

Last Friday, the Ministry of Health funded Sexwise Performance Group performed to Years 9-13 and followed that up with two workshops. This is the third time the school has hosted Sexwise and they remain popular with students. The performances deal directly with many issues our young people face from STIs, pornography and relationships, to sexuality, sexual orientation and friendships. The performance is edgy and speaks to students in straightforward terms, presenting issues in simple ways they can all understand. The workshops that follow explore some of the thornier issues raised during the performance in more detail and allows students to give advice to the characters and look at alternative actions they could take in those situations. While an important part of the health curriculum, sometimes these topics make us uneasy. Richard Wilkins, (Guidance Counsellor) and Rebekah Blease (District Health Nurse) remain available for any students or parents if they would like to discuss any issues raised around these topics.



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
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
