Kia ora.

What a packed start to the year we have had. We have had RYDA (Road Safety) for our year 11 cohort, which involved a trip to Blenheim to learn about various topics including why the safety rating of your car is important, stopping/braking distances, how to clear your mind ready to drive and situational awareness (amongst many other things). We have also had numerous students start their Trades Academy and Gateway journeys, which has seen a significant number go "off-site" into the workplace for a day a week to experience the "real world". We also have a large number of students who are taking advantage of learning through NET NZ and Te Kura, which allows us despite being a small school, to provide and support a huge range of subjects.

We held our whole school swimming sports on the 12th and a number of senior students braved the cold water for glory (although my respect goes out to the sheer number of Year 1-8 tamariki who literally flung themselves into the water in the quest for invaluable house points).

As we approach the end of the term many of our NCEA students in Years 11-13 will be engaging in vital assessment opportunities, so it is prudent for us to remember to encourage them to complete work at home, ask timely assistance from their teachers when needed and ensure that they are getting an appropriate amount of rest and recuperation when they can. In some subject areas we already have our first assessments in, so now would be a great time for whanau to check in to see how your children are progressing.

Our Year 10 students are also approaching a crucial time in their learning journeys as next term will provide many of them with their first opportunity to attempt the Common Assessment Activities (CAAs) for Literacy and Numeracy. These assessments are now the prerequisite for gaining Literacy and Numeracy qualifications in NZ. These assessments are sat as external (exams) and are run twice a year in Term 2 and Term 3, so there are plenty of opportunities for students to sit them from year 10 onwards. Looking forward, we have Tournament week coming up, and many of those students attending will continue (I am sure) to work on their assessments when they have some free time, but just as importantly they will have the opportunity to represent our amazing community and participate against




