We are well and truly on the countdown towards our year 11-13 students entering the External Assessment period (exams!).

For many this will be the opportunity to consolidate all skills and ideas that they have learnt over the years. For others it will be a chance to gain an endorsement (which is recognition of a student's success at Merit or Excellence level).

With this in mind it is a great opportunity for us to remind you that their learning journey does not simply end when the exams start, only students who have already met the requirements of their respective level will be granted "study leave".

For some students we will be expecting them to continue attending school and working towards gaining the skills and knowledge they need to ensure success.

The overall arbiter of study leave is Ms Furness, and she has already had this discussion with a number of students and we will be reiterating this next Thursday morning when our senior students will attend their final assembly of the year.

During this assembly NCEA students will receive their exam admission slips/cards- these must be brought with them to all exams and must be shown to the exam centre manager. They are important documents, so please ensure they are taken care of.

As an additional note attached to this we are obliged to reiterate that "study leave" is a time for students to be studying and revising (and attending tutorials in school). Students should not be signing themselves up for additional working hours when they would traditionally be in school.

This is also the first newsletter since I had the privilege of going on camp with our year 9 and 10s. This was an amazing experience and I can say that I am genuinely proud of how all students conducted themselves. I am envious of the year 10s who were fortunate enough not only to have perfect weather for their overnight tramp, but also then be treated to fresh snow at the summit (which had arrived the day before).

I would like to extend my personal thanks to Haley and Tania, the gang at Rotoiti Lodge and the Tapawera staff, who made the entire experience run smoothly.

As always, I thank you all for your support, opportunities such as camp, Spirit of Adventure, Pet Day and Touch Rugby could not happen with the support of you, and as a community we should rightly be proud of our efforts.

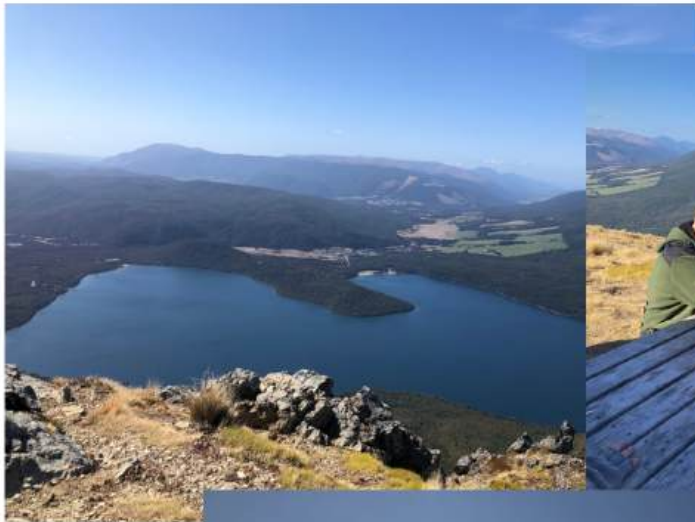
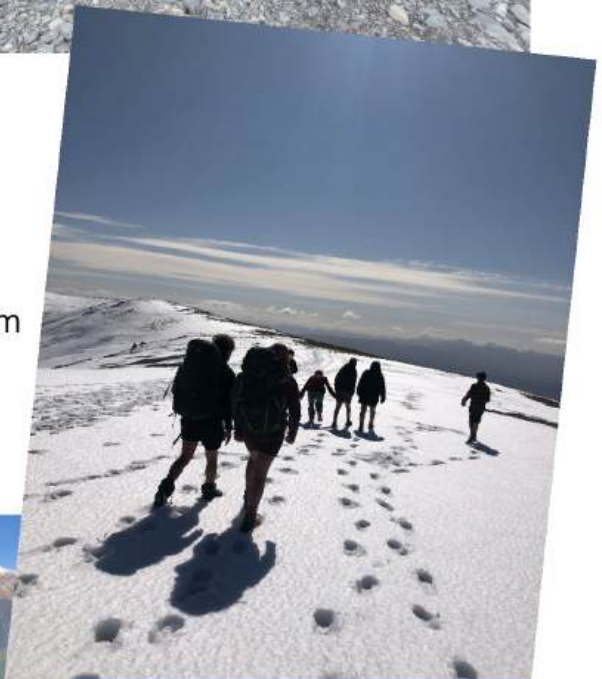




YEAR 9 & 10 CAMP PT 2

Child car restraints information to Whanau

International best practice recommends the use of an appropriate child restraint (or booster seat) until your child reaches 148 cm tall.

Under New Zealand law, all children under seven years of age must use an approved child restraint appropriate for their age and size. Children aged seven must be secured in a restraint if one is available in the vehicle.

If you are unsure of the child restraint rules, or if your car seat complies, or if you are unsure about how any child restraint should be fitted in your car you can contact Emma on 027 390 0767 to make an appointment for advice.

Dear resident/business operator,

State Highway 6 Rai Saddle Resilience Works

Between 8am, Monday 14 October, and 5pm, Friday 22 November 2024, work will be in place at SH6, Rai Valley, between Mt Richmond Estate Motels and the top of the Rai Saddle.

The resilience works will be in place at three locations (one site at a time) within the overall site, with crews installing kerb, barriers, and pipework to protect the highway from the effects of future rainfall events.

In order to safely complete the work, one lane will be closed and traffic will be managed using stop/go traffic lights, day and night. Temporary speed restrictions of 30km/h will be in place 24/7 at the site.

Road users should allow an additional 30 minutes for travel, due to multiple worksites in place between Blenheim and Nelson during this time.

Emergency Services will always be accommodated through the site, and are advised to contact the project team directly as shown below, to allow travel in an emergency.

During Labour Weekend (26 to 28 October), the road will be re-opened from midday, Friday 25 to midnight Monday 28 October, 2024. From that time, the crew will resume the work, in order to finish late-November, well before the Christmas holidays.

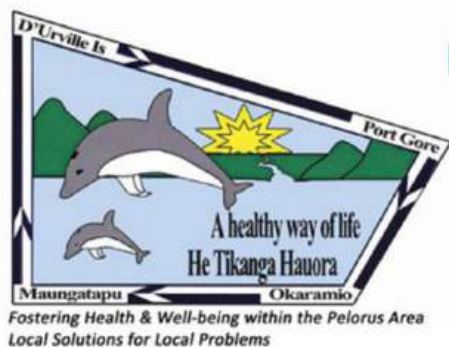
