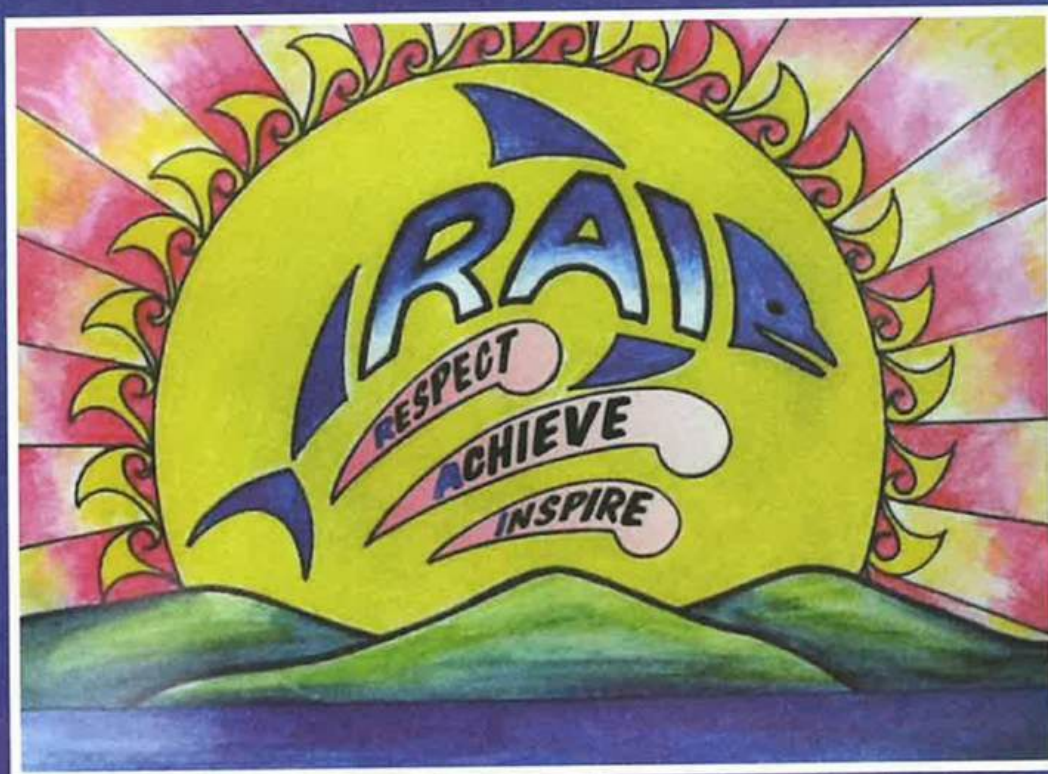

Congratulations to Pelorus house on winning the first event of the year. The introduction of a mini triathlon was well received. Thank you to Mr Briasco and your team for a great day.

The recent teacher only day focussed on the new curriculum. Our primary and maths staff joined the other schools from Pelorus cluster to undertake the first of 4 workshops unpacking the new Mathematic and statistics curriculum . Our Secondary staff worked on updating literacy approaches in our school.

On Tuesday next week there will be a parents evening for Years 1-8 parents. I would like to suggest that if you could attend please do. An important part of the evening is looking at the changes in the approaches to reading and mathematics. For those of you who have older students you will be noticing some differences of approach.

There have been large changes to our national curriculum, with a new English and Numeracy curriculum being rolled out from the beginning of this year. Rai Valley Area School has signed onto the BSLA programme (currently Years 1-4) for literacy and Numicon for mathematics (years 0-8). Both of these programmes provide a more structured approach to learning and teaching, and we would like to share with you how this is working in our classrooms and how you can support this learning at home. - Once you reach your school, select it with the tick on the righthand side.
- Tap the 'select schools' button in the top right corner.
- Tap the big orange choose button. This will load your school and bring you to the settings page.
- Subscribe to the groups that are relevant to you, then click the 'go back' button on your phone, which will bring you to the main screen of your schools app.

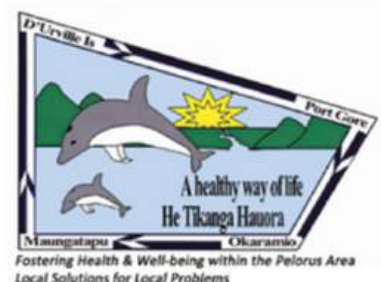

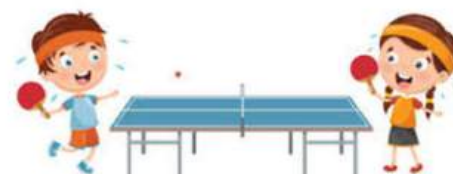
