

School lunches are back up and running for the year after an initial hiccup on day one. School has been busy with trades people since the beginning of January. The old boiler has finally been removed as well as the remaining asbestos. The upgrade for the primary toilets began at the beginning of January. It is looking great and hopefully will be completed next week. We have also had a number of classrooms recarpeted this week as part of the Ministries upgrade for small and rural schools.

Attendance continues to be a key focus for the Ministry of Education and at their last meeting the Board reviewed our school's draft attendance plan. Other key priorities this year will be the introduction of a national assessment (SMART) for Years 1 -8 in reading, writing and maths. This year there will also be a new format for reporting to parents at mid and end of year for Years 1-10.

The remaining weeks of the term are going to be busy. Primary Camp for years 5 - 8 are heading to Curious Cove next week. The Pelorus Cluster swimming sports are at Linkwater next week and Blenheim the following week.

Tournament this year is at Tapawera in the week 22nd to 27th March. Training is well underway and our students are working hard.

Finally a number of our year 12 and 13 students will have their first day at NMIT Trades Academy on Friday 20th. They are studying a range of courses for example Hospitality, Mechanical Engineering, Aquaculture & Marine Conservation and Sports & Exercise.. This is a great opportunity to explore their interests.

- Year 5–8: Camp is heading to Curious Cove later this term!
- Seniors: Customer Service Training, Trades, and Gateway placements are underway, with Whenua Iti, First Aid, and Uniformed Services on the horizon.
- Academics: Our Year 11–13 students have hit the ground running with assessment opportunities already in full swing.

Important Reminders

Uniform Policy

Uniform is compulsory for **Years 7 through 13**. Students are expected to be in full uniform while at school and during school-based activities.

- Need a pass? If a uniform item is unavailable, please provide a note from home so we can issue a temporary "uniform pass."
- Forgotten items? We can often issue uniform items on a temporary basis for those who may have misplaced theirs or didn't quite get the laundry done in time!

Mobile Phones

We are obliged to maintain Ministry and Government directives regarding mobile phones:

- Year 10 & below: Must hand phones into the office every morning (collect at the end of the day).
 - Years 11–13: May keep phones turned off in their bags.
 - Policy: If a phone is seen or disturbs learning, the student will be asked to put it away. Repeated issues will require the phone to be handed into the office. This is a non-negotiable policy, and we appreciate your support.

With the sunny weather, we are mindful of UV exposure.


- Primary: Teachers supervise sunscreen application.




Primary News: Room 4 Year 6, 7, & 8

Room 4 - Year 6, 7, 8

It's been a busy and productive start to the year in Room 4, with students settling back into their routines and diving straight into their specialist subjects.

A major highlight for the whole class has been our twice-weekly science lessons in the lab with Mr. Mac. We are happy to report that despite plenty of bubbling experiments, the school remains fully intact and Mr. Mac hasn't blown anything up—honest! It has been a particularly special opportunity for our Year 6s, who usually have to wait until Year 7 to access the lab regularly; they have stepped up to the challenge with great focus and enthusiasm.



When we aren't in the lab, our older students have been busy with their technology units. The Year 7s are currently working through their wood technology projects, while the Year 8s are based in the kitchen for food technology. The hallway is often filled with great aromas, and the students are developing practical skills that we hope might even result in a few home-cooked dinners soon.

Back in our own classroom, we have hit the ground running with our core subjects. In Maths and Reading, everyone is focused on getting back into the swing of things, while in Writing, we have been exploring how to create mood and atmosphere. The students are currently practicing how to use sensory imagery to set a scene, and it has been great to see their creativity coming through as they experiment with different writing styles.

Looking ahead, the energy in the room is high as we count down to our school camp at Curious Cove. From discussing cabin groups to checking off packing lists, the anticipation is building for what promises to be a fantastic few days of team-building and outdoor adventure.

Reminder for Parents: Please ensure all camp medical and consent forms are returned to Room 4 as soon as possible.

Please be aware of vehicles at school and especially at these busy times of before and after school.

Secondary News: GATEWAY, TRADES & STAR + D.O.E

At Rai Valley Area School, Year 12 and 13 students have the opportunity to do Vocational Pathways. Some of the resources available to the students to gain employable skills are:

GATEWAY - supplies funding for students to gain structured workplace learning.

TOTSTA - Top of the South Trades Academy. It is a partnership between regional secondary schools, the Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology (NMIT), and Whenua Iti Outdoors, designed for year 11, 12, and 13 students. The programme allows students to remain enrolled at their secondary school while gaining practical, hands-on vocational training (trades) in fields like engineering, construction, hospitality, or tourism. Participants work towards NCEA Level 2 and Level 3 qualifications, as well as specific industry certifications, aiming to bridge the gap between school and employment or further tertiary study. The programme is designed to help students start training for a career while completing their school education.

STAR - Secondary Tertiary Alignment Resource is a fund to support students to transition to further study and employment. All Y12/13 students will be taking part in a Customer Service course, on the 26th of February, courtesy of The Learning Place to gain employable skills in customer service.



Secondary News: Year 9 & 10 form class


In this year's Year 9 and 10, we welcomed Nelia, Jasmine and Christopher into our class. Early in the week, during form time and in our first health period we have been discussing the school uniform policy. We clarified what was uniform and what was required to be worn during PE lessons, lunchtime sports and tournament training sessions. All Year 9 and 10 students should now be able to explain the 'science of sweat' and why at this age it is very important to be changing into other clothes for exercising.

We also focused on the school's sunsmart policy, and students developed an understanding of continuing the sunsmart practices of Year 7 and 8 students. At this age, we strongly recommend students use the freely available sunscreen and wear a suitable sun hat when outside. We discussed how a bucket hat provides more coverage of the ears, neck and face compared to a cap. Another sunsmart initiative to protect students from the sun, is that singlets are not permitted to be worn as PE clothing or during school sports practices. A t-shirt provides better coverage from the sun. We also encourage the wearing of a rash top when swimming, to give added sun protection.

The school has many shady areas such as under the trees, the library or in the secondary seating area for students to sit in, to get out of the direct sunlight. At the start of summer, in Term 4 last year, fresh supplies of sunscreen were issued and these are available through-out the school, in most classrooms, and includes the secondary kitchen / locker area, library, office and hall.

Over the year we are focusing on building independent, responsible students - students will develop an understanding of how to be responsible for one's self (key competency of self management). This includes being prepared for lessons, following a timetable, having the correct school uniform and PE uniform, being sunsmart and looking after one's property is a focus for the year.
