Common Assessment Activities (CAA):

Some of our senior students have completed the first round of the Literacy and Numeracy CAAs. These assessments form the baseline for Level 1, ensuring our seniors have the essential skills required as they prepare to transition out of school in the future.

We are gearing up for Matariki, and more information about our celebrations will be sent out shortly. The big focus at the moment, however, is preparing for the highly anticipated Community & Staff vs. Students Kī-o-Rahi match!

The event has been officially titled "Redemption" (though some of the staff are calling it "Revenge"). The students have held the shield since its inception two years ago, so it is high time the adults got our hands on it. Start warming up, team!

Mobile Phones:

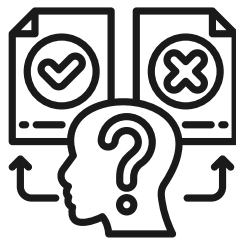
A reminder that for students in Year 10 and below, mobile phones must be handed into the office at the start of the day. We will ensure they are kept locked away safely and returned at the end of the day.

We have had a busy and productive few weeks in Room 14. Here is a quick look at what our Year 1 and 2 students have been learning:

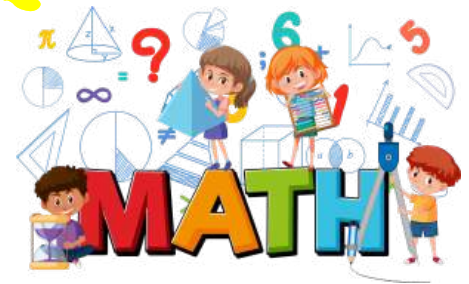
Football Skills and Cross Country Practice

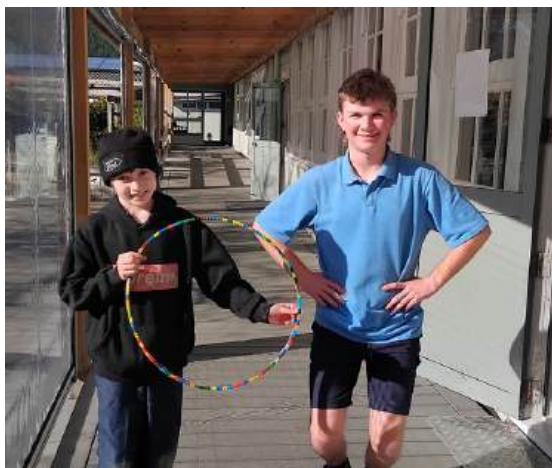

News from the Board of Trustees

"At this month's Board of Trustees meeting, one of the exciting discussions was around student voice and school uniform options for our secondary students. After requests from students for hoodies to become part of the school uniform, the Board was pleased to approve moving forward with the introduction of a school uniform hoodie option. As a rural school in often cold and foggy Rai Valley, we understand the importance of practical, comfortable clothing that students actually want to wear. The Board values listening to our students and working alongside them, and we're hopeful this new addition will be something students are excited to wear while continuing to take pride in their school uniform.

We are also pleased to see the primary toilet block renovations and upgrades nearing completion, which will be a great improvement for our students and school environment. Alongside this, we are excited to see the new preschool addition, Rai Valley Nurture, become part of the wider school community. We hope this will be a valuable asset for local families and help support work-life balance for parents by having early childhood education closely connected to the school.

The Board also reviewed several policies this month, including the Daily School Bus policy and a number of Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) policies covering governance, roles and responsibilities, and risk assessment and management. As a Board, it is very important to us that when our children are participating in excursions, camps, sporting events and other learning opportunities outside the classroom, every effort has been made to identify and manage risks appropriately. We want our students to continue enjoying valuable out-of-classroom learning experiences while ensuring their safety and wellbeing remain a top priority. Parents and Whānau are encouraged to take part in the policy review process and provide feedback through SchoolDocs.

We were also incredibly proud to hear that 8 of our students recently attended sports trials in Murchison and have all successfully qualified for nationals, which will be held in Whāngarei this June. This is a fantastic achievement and a credit to the hard work and dedication of these students. Over the coming weeks, you may notice fundraising activities happening around the community to help get these students to nationals with as little financial pressure on families as possible. Every contribution, big or small, is greatly appreciated. For many of our rural students, this is not only an exciting sporting opportunity, but also a chance to experience travelling and competing in a large city environment. We congratulate these students and wish them all the very best for nationals.

The Board is also currently looking for a new trustee to join our team following the farewell of valued board member Purity Ready, whose energy and contribution to the Board will be greatly missed. We would love to hear from any parents or community members who may be interested in becoming involved. In particular, someone with a financial background would be a fantastic addition as we continue working to support the school and ensure strong governance moving forward."



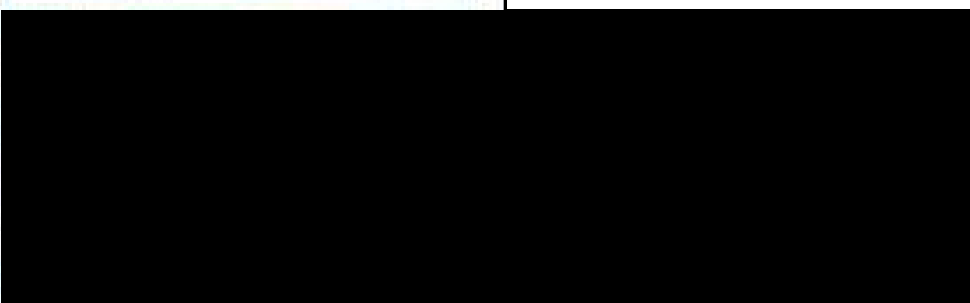
